<i>Because a victim will not live more then 8 – 10 minutes without breathing.</i>

12. How does CPR differ from the Heimlich maneuver?	416	296-298
<i>Heimlich maneuver is used to for an object stuck in the throat and</i>		
<i>victim cannot breath.</i>		
13. What are the steps you do in order to perform the Heimlich maneuver?	416	296-298

<i>Put arms around victim's waist and clasp hands together</i>		
<i>Place knuckle of one thumb at or above victim's navel</i>		
<i>Thrust clasped hands inward & upward</i>

16. What are the two types of fractures? <i>Closed – broken bone that does not cut through the skin</i> <i>Open – broken bone that pierces the skin (compound fracture)</i>	432 - 437	315

18. If you were camping in the mountains and someone broke his leg, demonstrate how you would get him out?	436 - 439	325-329
19. How do you treat internal poisoning? <i>Take container to phone and call 911 or Poison Control Center (local hospital emergency room)</i>	417	302
20. When do you induce vomiting? <i>Only when told to do so by medical professionals</i>	417	302
21. Name the three kinds of burns? <i>First – Degree</i> <i>Second – Degree</i> <i>Third - Degree</i>	420 - 424	306-307
22. How do you treat each kind? <i>First degree – cool with water and apply moist loose bandage</i> <i>Second degree – cool with water and apply moist loose bandage. Do not break blisters.</i> <i>Third degree – wrap in clean sheet, keep warm and call 911 for medical help.</i>	422	306-307
23. How do you treat blisters? <i>Wash area with soap and water and apply mole skin. If you think it will break sterilize a pin and prick blister near edge. Drain fluid and cover with sterile bandage.</i>	422	308
24. What else do you treat for in a burn? <i>Any of the HURRY CASES and shock.</i>	420	306
25. How do you treat a puncture wound? <i>Encourage wound to bleed</i> <i>Use sterile tweezers to remove debris from wound</i> <i>Wash wound area with soap and water</i> <i>Apply sterile bandage</i> <i>Get victim to a doctor</i>	428	305
26. How do you treat something in the eye? What do you not do? <i>Have the person blink his/her eyes, and tears may flush out the object.</i> <i>Or pull one eyelid over the other and eyelashes will sweep object out.</i> <i>Or flush with lots of water.</i>	427	314
27. How do you treat an insect bite? <i>Scrape stinger out with fingernail or knife blade. Relieve pain with ice water or cold towel.</i>	423	310-311
28. What First Aid injuries could you treat with your neckerchief?		
29. What is hypothermia? How do you treat it? <i>Low body temperature. Occurs when the body is losing more heat than it can generate. Symptoms include: feeling chilly , tired, slurred speech, and shivers.</i> <i>Treatment: Get victim indoors or in a tent, remove wet clothing, get them into a sleeping bag or under blankets and warm them up slowly. If victim cannot warm themselves you will need to take your clothes off and get inside the sleeping bag with them.</i>	431	322-324

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30. Name the signs of heat stroke. How do you treat Heat Stroke? <i>Red hot face, small pupils, slow noisy breathing, rapid strong pulse And victim may be come unconscious. Treatment: get victim to a cool place, have victim lie down, raise head, Remove some of the victim's clothing and cool off with wet rags.</i>	430	319-321

How do you purify water? 1. <i>Boil for at least 1 minute.</i> 2. <i>Add water purification tablets and wait at least 30 minutes.</i> 3. <i>Use correct type of water purification filter.</i> 4. <i>Chlorox may also be used at 2 drops per gallon and let stand for at least 30 minutes.</i>	98 - 99	256
31. How do you treat the following: Poisonous plants <i>Wash area with soap and water, apply calomine lotion and try not to scratch. Remove clothing and launder.</i>	428 - 429	59 & 318
Snake bite <i>Remove any jewelry that might cause problems if the area swells, Have victim lie down and position the bitten part lower than the rest of the body. Treat for shock. Get victim to a doctor.</i>	426	313
Nosebleed <i>Have victim sit up and lean forward to prevent blood from draining down the throat. Apply a cool, wet cloth to victim's nose and face.</i>	420	306
Rabid animal bite <i>Wash area with soap and water, cover wound with sterile bandage and get victim to doctor. Call police or animal control to capture animal.</i>	425	312
Person on fire <i>Stop, Drop and Roll or roll victim on ground or in a blanket or sleeping bag to smother fire, then treat burns.</i>	440	
Frostbite <i>Get victim inside a tent or building then warm the frostbitten area. Avoid rubbing the frostbitten area, as that can damage tissue and skin. Do not allow area to refreeze and get victim to a doctor.</i>	430 - 431	324
